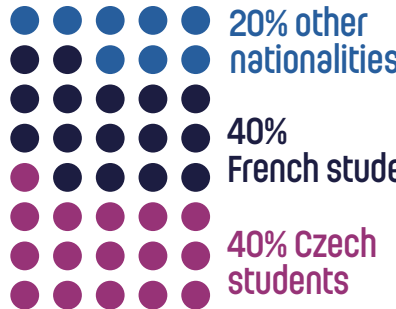

A total of 136 students, divided into 6 classes from first to third year (seconde, première and terminale), attend the LFP in this last stage of secondary education.

All secondary school classes are certified by the French Ministry of Education and gradually lead the students towards successfully completing the university entrance exam (Baccalauréat), which is the first French university diploma recognised by all universities and tertiary institutions around the world.

New for 2022-2023!

Inauguration of the British international section in the seconde year. Pupils in this section will be able to take the French International Baccalauréat in 2025!

1st year (Seconde)

The 1st year (seconde) is designed so that students successfully complete the transition from the second level (collège) to secondary school. Its goal is to give them the greatest possible choice of the direction they will take in their academic lives.

It provides them with a common general education whilst allowing them to discover new areas in literature, economics, sciences, etc.

In order to help students to begin to think about their future plans, this year also focuses more deeply on two main objectives, namely: becoming familiar with the world of work and how to get one's bearings in it, and becoming acquainted with university study options and the student's prospects.

Teaching timetable in the 1st year

- compulsory subjects for all students represent 80 % of a student's total timetable
- two elective subjects, of which one is in the economics field, in addition to which students may take one elective subject.

2nd year (Première)

The 2nd year (première) is designed so that students become more specialised, but at the same time offers a common compulsory education in six subjects.

The goal is to give students a common culture, whilst at the same time allowing them to develop their plan for tertiary education.

In addition to these common compulsory subjects, students also select from three specialisations (4 hours per subject per week), to which they can also add an elective subject.

An ongoing assessment process begins in this 2nd year (première), which will count towards the final university entrance exam score.

3rd year (Terminale)

The 3rd year (terminale) is the last year of secondary school prior to the university entrance exam (Baccalauréat) and before continuing on to higher education.

The 3rd year also continues to offer a common foundation comprising six compulsory subjects.

Besides these common subjects, students also select two specialisations (6 hours), to which they can also add a maximum of two elective subjects.

The ongoing assessment process for the university entrance exam (Baccalauréat) continues in the 3rd year (terminale).

University Entrance Exam Diploma (Diplôme du Baccalauréat)

The University Entrance Exam Diploma (Baccalauréat) is a diploma validating the acquisition of the knowledge and skills, concluding secondary school education and representing the first stage in higher education in France and in the Czech Republic, and it is recognized in most countries in the world. In this way, it enables the student to continue his/her studies at university.

The first part of this exam begins in June of the 2nd year (première) of studies with a written and oral exam in French. It then continues in the 3rd year (terminale) in two stages:

- in Spring: two final exams from the specialisations selected by the student
- in June: a written exam in Philosophy and an oral exam on the subjects chosen for specialisation.

To the above are added exams held during the course of the ongoing assessment during the 2nd and 3rd year (première and terminale).

The results of the ongoing assessment represent 40 % of the final University Entrance Exam (Baccalauréat) score.

The results attained during the final exams represent 60 % of the final University Entrance Exam (Baccalauréat) score.
