
Fun fact:

In Rwanda, 70% of the population works in agriculture, therefore, Rwandan women are unlikely to choose a career in science. They often remark that "it is difficult for women and it's useless because they will only get married and do something else". They are also not privileged.

They have helped many students like Emelyne K. who wants to achieve her dream of becoming a computer engineer and now knows how to develop this career because of Starlight and Career Girls.


Starlight also has projects such as kits to make it more entertaining and interesting, these kits include a manual and the tools to make a solar torch in a few hours. (details about one of their projects)

Starlight Africa now counts **4000 students** talking about their activities and have raised **100,000 euros**, but because of Covid, their activity was slowed down, but they hope it will come back to normal.


Today we will be rating Mr. Mansfield's (Teacher) recommendation, "Loveless" (Album) by "my bloody valentine".

Vasa's Art Tips :D


Hello there fellow human! In these series I will be sharing some of my tips on drawing, I hope I will be able to help some artists out there!



Also, what I've seen happen a lot is artists getting asked for advice, and afterwards saying to "just practice" don't get me wrong, practice is important. but do keep in mind that people usually struggle with certain aspects of their drawings that later on keep them from achieving further progress.




Personally, I'm not the best at giving advice, but I will do my best. I draw a lot of characters, and I've had a lot of people come up to me asking for advice on how to draw heads, hands, etc. So if you want to give advice I would focus on a certain detail that the person has issues with.



From what I've seen people struggle a lot with drawing heads and proportions. So I will share with you how I usually draw My character's head (keep in mind It's my personal style and this is just an example of what I usually do). Start off with drawing a circle and proportion lines to rule out where The character is looking.



Now add 2 lines on the side which are the beginning of the jaw. scratch on the left/right ear, it doesn't have to be perfect, the 2 lines will define the jaw line so feel free to play around with that.



Shape out the head, try to focus on the back of the head and imagine how it looks from the back. don't be afraid to add some 3d volume, (remember to use the proportion lines to help you out) Also I added elf ears because I can haha :3 There you go! Sorry again If it wasn't much help, but I hope I could help you at least a bit!





Hello, our names are Lillian and Anezka, and we'd like to share our thoughts on the horror film Mama.

We chose to watch Mama, a horror film, and write a report about it. Despite several "jump sequences," the film was not as frightening as we had anticipated.

During the prologue, we witness a frantic executive, Lucas (played by Nikolaj Coster-Waldau), rush into his house, carry his two daughters, Lilly (age 1) and Victoria (age 3), into his car, and drive away. We see Lucas is tense and has a few scrapes on his face, and we hear on the radio that there was a shooting, and that Lucas killed his wife and fled with his children.

Lucas collides with a tree in a woodland while driving too quickly.

They all make it out alive and hide in an abandoned house, where Lucas tries to murder his children before killing himself, but he has a hard time doing it because he loves them.

But, just as he is ready to do so, something attacks and kills him, but what is it?

The film is like a rollercoaster; some scenes are pleasant and amusing, while others give you the chills. If we ignore the ghost Mama, the movie makers succeeded in making it incredibly realistic and easily credible. The recommended viewing age is 15 and up, however we think it should be about 12 and up because it isn't too frightening. 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


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
